If the athlete registered online (<https://worldtkd.simplycompete.com>) does not take part in the competition for some reason, but he/she has not been removed from the list of participants before the [deadline \(27.05.2018\)](#), his/her team official must fully (100%) pay his/her entry fee for participation. Entry fee is not refundable at any time after the deadline

Condition for Participation

WT Global Athlete Licence (GAL) and **WT Event Pass** is mandatory for all competitors in WT categories. All participants must be prepared to proof their age by presenting their valid passport or ID-card at registration. Starting permission for children and minors lies within the clubs' responsibility (mind the liability exclusion!). By filing the application the contestants agree that their names will be published on the list of participants and result lists in the internet.

Anti-Doping

The competitor accepts the Anti-Doping rules of the World Taekwondo Federation and the National Anti-Doping Agency Austria (NADA), www.nada.at/en.

With the application all athletes commit themselves to refraining from all actions which are incompatible with the principles of fairness in sport and ensuring by all means at their disposal that no prohibited substances enter their body tissue or body fluids and no prohibited methods are used on them.

Liability

All participants take part at their own risk. No liability of any kind will be assumed by the promoter or organiser. By handing over the registration form the competitors and the coaches expressly agree with the liability exclusion. The sole responsibility for informing the competitors resp. their legal guardians about this liability exclusion as well as for adequate discipline of the competitors at the tournament lies with the coach

Pair competition: 2 athletes (m+f) **Team competition:** 3 athletes (m+m+m / f+f+f)

On principle all members of a pair / team must be of the appropriate age.

Exception: In the Junior category a pair / team may consist of juniors and cadets, but in any case they will have to compete in the Junior class!

Compulsory Poomsae

All Poomsae will be drawn by lot for each category out of the corresponding pool of compulsory Poomsae. The forms have to be presented in the same order as they were drawn.

The drawing of the Poomsae will be performed by the competition board on Monday, **30th May 2018**, and will be sent out immediately thereafter via TPSS to all subscribed clubs. It will also be announced on austrianopen.otdv.at

Method of Competition – Recognized Poomsae

Single-Elimination System

U30 Male and Female, U40 Male and Female Individual Divisions only.

Cut off system

- **1st round (Preliminary; 20 or more contestants):** Two Poomsae in accordance with drawing, the best 50% proceed to the next round. If the number of contestants is odd, then the number will be rounded to make even. (E.g. if there are 25 contestants in the category, then 13 contestants shall advance to the semi-final.)
In order to keep the time schedule, very large categories can be split into 2 pools, each group performing on a different court. In that case the best 50% of each pool will advance to round 2.
- **2nd round (Semi-final; 9 to 19 contestants):** Two Poomsae in accordance with drawing, the best 8 athletes qualify for the final.
- **3rd round (Final; 1 to 8 contestants):** Two Poomsae in accordance with drawing.

Note: The individual, pair and team divisions up to 11 years – **Children** – will start from semi-final (9 and more contestants) or final (1 to 8 contestants) – **No 1st round !**

The organizer reserves the right to reduce the number of Poomsae to be performed in the preliminary and / or the semi-final round to one (1) form.

Procedure in Case of Equal Score – Recognized Poomsae

a) In case there is a tied score after the completion of the preliminary round at the last place of the best 50%, respectively on the 8th rank of the semi-final round, the higher points in presentation will be the determining factor for advancement to the next round. If this score is equal as well, all athletes in question will proceed.

b) In case there is a tied score after the completion of the final round on the rank 1, 2, or 3, the contestant who is awarded more points in presentation shall be declared the winner. In case the score is still tied, then the one who has higher total points (including highest and lowest points) shall be the winner. If it's still tied then a rematch between the contestants in question shall be conducted. The referee will decide on the Poomsae to be performed (in any case one of the compulsory Poomsae).

Age categories are based on the year of birth (explanation see Recognized Poomsae).

Basic Information – Freestyle Poomsae

The music for the Freestyle performance should be sent until Monday, 8th of June per e-mail to: austrianopen@otdv.at

If possible, bring along the music file on a USB-stick or on CD as back up.

- Each performance shall have a duration from 60 seconds to 70 seconds.
- Performed techniques must be within the boundaries of taekwondo.
- Music & choreography shall be the choice of the contestant.
- Scoring shall be made in accordance with the rules of the WT.

Method of Competition – Freestyle Poomsae

Only 1 round (final), independent of number of athletes.

Procedure in Case of Equal Score – Freestyle Poomsae

- a) In case there is a tied score after the completion of a Freestyle category on the rank 1, 2, or 3, the contestant who is awarded more points in **Technical Skills** shall be declared the winner. In case the score is still tied, then the one who has higher total points (including highest and lowest points) shall be the winner. If it's still tied then a rematch between the contestants in question shall be conducted, where they will have to perform the same Freestyle Poomsae once again.

Categories – Para Taekwondo Poomsae

The Austrian Para Taekwondo Poomsae open is NOT a WT Para Taekwondo World Ranking event and WT International Classification for Para Taekwondo will not be available at the Austrian Para Taekwondo Poomsae Open

General Information

Para Poomsae: Cut off system.

Division P 20: The Para-Taekwondo Poomsae (P20) competitions for Intellectually Disabled athletes.

Division P 30: The Para-Taekwondo Poomsae (P30) competitions for athletes with a Physical Impairment.

Poomsae: Taeguk and WT Poomsae (own choice).

WT Para Taekwondo Poomsae Competition Rules as of January 1, 2017

P10 – Visual Impairments

Athletes Competing in Para Taekwondo competition for the first time must undergo IBSA Classification or National Classification prior to the Competition Date.

P20 – Intellectually Impairments

Intellectually Impaired Athletes Competing in Para Taekwondo competition for the first time must first establish Provisional Eligibility through INAS.

In the case that a WTF MNA does not have an INAS Member Organization, the application for INAS Provisional Eligibility can be processed through the WTF at para-tkd@wtf.org

P30 – Physical Impairments

Athletes Competing in Para Taekwondo competition for the first time must undergo Classification. The Physically Impaired athletes that have never been through Para Taekwondo Classification or are Classified with Review Status must undergo classification **on June 02th**, where a WT Classification Panel will be available.

For those teams who are not sure if the athletes meet the Minimum Impairment Criteria and need assistance determining the Class for an individual athlete, please submit this form:

P31 - diplegia, asymmetric diplegia, double hemiplegia or triplegia

P32 - dyskinesias, athetosis, dystonia, ataxia, mild spastic quadriplegia or a combination of the above

P33 - spastic hemiplegia or very mild spastic hemi-dystonia

P34 - very mild hemiplegia, diplegia, athetosis, dystonia, hemi-dystonia and very mild ataxia

Combination of Classes and Divisions

Once an athlete has been consolidated into another class, he or she will compete for further medals in that class

Method of Competition – Recognized Poomsae

Single-Elimination System

Minimum Qualification

1. Holder of the nationality of the participating team
2. Holder of refugee status recognized by the WT and/or IPC

3. One recommended by the WT Member National Association
4. Holder of WT Global Athlete License (GAL) and WT Event Pass
5. Holder of a 8 Geup to 1 Geup certificate, issued by the WT MNA
6. Holder of a Dan certificate issued by the WT
7. The contestant has been assigned a Para Taekwondo Sport Class and Sport Class Status

Equipment

Participating contestants shall wear the WT-recognized taekwondo uniform.
Kup holders with white basic uniform only (no black collar, no colored trousers)!

International Referees

Invitations for International Poomsae Referees will basically be made by the ÖTDV. However, International Referees interested in officiating at the Austrian Open Poomsae 2016 can send an e-mail to the Organising Committee indicating their interest.

Protest

Arbitration board, protest charges and possible changes of the course of events will be announced at the head of team meeting.

Award Presentation

The awarding ceremony for the individual, pair and team categories will take place right after the respective contest on the competition area.

Medals for place 1, 2, 3 and 4 in each category; trophies for place 1, 2, and 3 in the team ranking.

Para Taekwondo Team Standings

Para Taekwondo Team Standing - team trophies - 1st, 2nd, 3rd

Calculations of Team Standings

The Team Standings is determined by the sum of the results of the individuals in a team. Points are calculated as follows:

GOLD - 7 POINTS

SILVER - 3 POINTS

BRONZE - 1 POINT

Medals earned from consolidations will be counted towards the Team Standings. Accordingly, an athlete can earn more than one medal for their team

Individual awards:

1st place – gold medal and certificate

2nd place – silver medal and certificate

3rd place – bronze medal and certificate

3rd place – bronze medal and certificate
